Western Society of Weed Science 61st Annual Conference March 11-14, 2008 Hyatt Regency Orange County Hotel Anaheim, California

The 61st annual meeting of the Western Society of Weed Science was held in Anaheim, CA at the Hyatt Regency Orange County Hotel on March 11-14, 2008. The meeting, with 347 registered members and guests, featured 53 research posters presented in two sessions and 105 scientific presentations. Graduate and undergraduate students combined to present 10 posters and 16 oral papers during the meeting. In addition to the regular program, two special symposia were held during the meeting to foster discussion on important weed science issues. The symposium on the biology, ecology, and impact of giant reed and common reed was highly successful and increased meeting attendance by at least 50 weed researchers, students, and land managers interested in these invasive riparian weed species.

Each year, the WSWS presents several awards for outstanding contributions to the Society and to the discipline of weed science. George Beck from Colorado State University and Rick Boydston from the USDA-ARS were named as WSWS Fellows and Robert Zemetra from the University of Idaho was named as Honorary Member. Patrick Clay from Valent, Robert Wilson from the University of Nebraska, and Leo Charvet from BASF were recognized as Outstanding Weed Scientists. The Professional Staff award was presented to Lori Howlett from the University of Nebraska and the Outstanding Weed Manager was Lars Baker from Freemont Co, Wyoming. Seven awards were presented for outstanding student presentations and posters in basic and applied research. Student presentation awardees included: Lydia Clayton from the University of Idaho, Dilpreet Riar from Washington State University, Amy Blair from Colorado State University, Travis Almquist from North Dakota State University, Jordana LaFantasie from the University of Wyoming. Student poster awards were given to Jordana LaFantasie from the University of Wyoming, Randall Stephens from Washington State University, and Jessica Ebler from New Mexico State University.

At the conclusion of the Societies business meeting, outgoing president Ron Crocket from Monsanto passed the ceremonial hoe to the incoming president Dan Ball from Oregon State University.
