Our Colorado Springs meeting at the Hotel Eleganté is just around the corner, so remember to submit your titles by the December 1st deadline. Also consider submitting a synopsis of your results to the WSWS Research Progress Report, due to Tracy Rauch by January 1st. The annual Progress Reports are an excellent venue to share preliminary results of efficacy, safety, and performance data of herbicides on western crops and weeds.

December 1st is also the deadline for you to nominate deserving members to be Fellows and Honorary Members of WSWS and also Outstanding Weed Scientists for Distinguished Service Awards in the private and public sector; for Outstanding Weed Scientists – Early Career in the private and public sector; and Outstanding Weed Scientists for weed managers and for professional staff. Please take time to think of colleagues who you would support and nominate for these WSWS peer recognitions.

The WSWS Awards Committee just recently selected the student recipients of the WSWS Student Scholarships. Although the committee received several applications that were all commendable, only three scholarships could be awarded. Krista Ehlert, Montana State University, Halley Berg, Montana State University, and Ashley Cunningham, New Mexico State University, will receive scholarships that will assist them with preparations and travel to at the WSWS meetings in Colorado Spring. Congratulations to each recipient and thank you to all the applicants for their diligent efforts. We look forward to hearing all of the applicants' presentations and encourage all students to participate in the student paper and poster competitions.

The Colorado meeting registration will open soon and I'm happy to report that the registration fees remain the same as last year, thanks to a reasonably healthy financial balance sheet.

I do hope you are impressed and excited by the look of the new WSWS website. I welcome your feedback on ways to improve the look or functionality. One new function we hope to implement soon is a committee sign-up feature. More on that in the next newsletter.

Prepare Now for Colorado Springs - by Drew Lyon, Program Chair

The title/author submission deadline for the 2014 annual meeting in Colorado Springs is Sunday, December 1. Friday, February 28, 2014 is the deadline for submitting the body of the abstract and keywords for indexing information. All submissions must follow the instructions described in the Papers & Posters tab found under the Annual Meeting tab at the WSWS website. The actual submission is done on the WSSA website at www.wssaabstracts.com. As of this writing, November 9, 2013, there were just 10 submissions on the WSSA online submissions website. I imagine that will increase dramatically as the December 1 deadline approaches. Remember, December 1 is a Sunday, so be careful that you don't leave work on Friday, November 30 thinking that you will make your submission on the following Monday. You will be too late and your opportunity to present your research at the meeting will be gone.

We do have a special symposium planned for the 2014 annual meeting in Colorado Springs. The symposium is entitled "*Biology and Management of Invasive Toadflax in the Western U.S.*" Invasive toadflax populations are widespread on public lands managed for timber, livestock grazing, recreation and wildlife habitat. Toadflax is especially problematic after fire, which has been all too common in Colorado and the western US in recent years. Sarah Ward is organizing the symposium that will include three other speakers and 45 minutes for a panel discussion and audience discussion.

Our meeting will kick-off Monday night with the Welcome and Retirees Reception. At the General Session the next morning, we will hear from WSWS President, Roger Gast, and Science Policy Director, Lee Van Wychen. We will also get a little local flavor on weed management from a team of speakers who will describe their integrated, multifaceted efforts to manage weeds across a wide range of land uses at the US Air Force Academy.

The Education and Regulatory Section Chair, Joel Felix, and Research Section Chair, Andrew Kniss, are both busy organizing their sessions. Andrew and each of his Project Chairs are planning thought-provoking discussions in Range and Natural Areas, Horticultural Crops, Agronomic Crops, Teaching and Technology Transfer, and Basic Biology and Ecology. These discussion sessions are a unique feature of our annual meetings and you want to make sure you participate in as many of them as you can.

Begin making plans to attend and participate in the WSWS annual meeting by registering early and making room reservations at the Hotel Eleganté Conference & Event Center in Colorado Springs for March 10-13, 2014. For those planning to fly to the annual meeting, flights can be booked into Colorado Springs or Denver, which is just 70 miles north of Colorado Springs. Don't forget that spring ski season in the Colorado Rockies will be going strong next March, so you may want to come early and/or stay late to catch some great skiing or other fun in the area.

We continue to ask WSWS members to consider submitting symposium proposals for future meetings in Portland in 2015 or Albuquerque in 2016. Members are encouraged to creatively design and plan symposia on current or regionally relevant topics. Refer to the spring 2013 issue of the WSWS Newsletter for instructions to submit symposium proposals.



Weed Control in Natural Areas in the Western United States



This book contains control options, both non-chemical and chemical, in full write-ups for nearly 242 species, with non-chemical and chemical options in a susceptibility table for a little under 100 additional species. Information is also provided on the variety of control techniques and equipment used in natural as well safety and environmental areas, as considerations, herbicide characteristics, rainfast periods and grazing and having restrictions for terrestrial herbicides, a list of species with biological control agents either available or under development, and helpful conversion tables.



2014 Western Invasive Weed Short Course

The 2014 Western Invasive Weed Short Course (WIWSC) is scheduled for April 14-17, 2014. Please note we had to change the previously announced dates due to the floods that devastated Sylvan Dale Guest Ranch.

WIWSC will remain in Loveland, Colorado but will be based at the La Quinta Inn & Suites. The format will remain similar to the 2013 Short Course with the course specifically tailored to the interests of the 2014 participants based on a pre-course survey.

WIWSC is an intensive study of current technologies and best management practices associated with noxious and invasive weeds in the western United States. Participants will gain up-to-date knowledge specific to invasive weed management with interactive sessions that include:

- Classroom lecture
- Hands-on demonstration
- Field plots
- Live weed and herbicide symptomology specimens
- Facilitated discussion
- Small group projects
- Educational games
- Time for individual interaction with instructors

Who should attend: Local, state, federal government, and other land managers throughout the western region desiring a better understanding of weed management. WIWSC is designed to benefit both those new to invasive plant management and experienced professionals seeking a comprehensive update in western invasive weeds and their management.

Who is teaching: WIWSC is taught by outstanding trainers representing the Western Society of Weed Science.

Enrollment information: The short course is limited to 40 participants. Enrollment is accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Registration: The registration fee (\$800.00 by January 31, 2014; \$900.00 on February 1, 2014) provides each attendee the educational program, a resource CD with presentations, other supplies and daily refreshment breaks. Three lunches and three dinners are also included in the registration.

Lodging at La Quinta Inn & Suites is not included in the registration fee. La Quinta provides a free continental breakfast.

CALL FOR 2014 RESEARCH PROGRESS REPORTS

The WSWS Research Progress Report is published to make significant new weed science research in the West available with the least possible delay. Early dissemination of weed research data is an important aid in formulating recommendations and in planning research. We encourage members of WSWS to submit pertinent new research data for publication in the Research Progress Report.

The Research Progress Report is produced on a very tight schedule. In order to expedite publication, all reports must be submitted in a "camera ready" condition. <u>The report must be prepared according to the specific directions outlined below.</u> Reports that do not strictly adhere to the requirements will be returned to the author. The report will be rejected if there is not time to make the necessary changes.

Each contributor must:

- 1. Follow instructions carefully and completely.
- 2. Obtain two additional reviews of each report and have each reviewer *print their name* at the bottom of the index outline. The two reviewers can be anyone other than the senior author of the report. The two reviews are a requirement for publication.
- 3. Send the report(s) via e-mail with an index outline for each report. Remember, the report will be printed as received.
- 4. Adhere strictly to the submission **deadline of January 6, 2014**. **Send an electronic copy** as a Microsoft Word file (doc or xdoc) or as an Acrobat file (pdf) attached via e-mail to **trauch@uidaho.edu**. After **submission, a reply will be sent upon receipt of a report. No reply means no report was received.**
