Thanks to the program committee.

The program will focus on the history of society, and follow with the "future" through research and education sections.

Discussion of non-herbicidal weed control inclusion in meetings, and where to put this research in the program – a new "project"

It is currently largely unregulated by USEPA and states.

Program needs to be "corrected" to include this area.

Current meeting has 153 presentations. 53 posters.

Steve Fennimore put together a symposium with 7 talks on machine weed control.

Research Section Chair - Judit Barroso

Had 5 projects in the research section. Rangeland, horticulture, agronomy, teaching technology, basic biology and ecology.

The session chairs will be their own computers, Sandra has the projectors.

Director of Science Policy – Lee van Wychen

Looking towards next farm bill. What is the future for weed science?

People-wise, Steve Young at ARS has been a great asset for Weed Science.

At one time, ARS had 75 weed scientists. Now, less than a dozen.

COVID has been a big aberration and issue

The "big money bills" have been absorbing all of the attention. Still need a big omnibus for FY2023 appropriations.

Infrastructure bill had the invasive plant removal program – \$50 M per year for invasive plant removal through Dept of Transportation. Authorized, but not appropriated.

FY2023 Farm Bill - \$70 M for plant diseases – all for pathogens and insects.

NAISMA has been working hard on this bill regarding invasive weeds as "pest organisms" under the \$70M program.

Also, Hydrilla in the Connecticut River.

The Survey of the Worst Weeds continues this year.

Steve asked about *Orobanche* as a candidate for a federal program.

Lee discussed the APHIS responsibility and the one successful weed eradication program.

CAST Representative – *Greg Dahl*

This has been a fun opportunity.

In October has a national meeting in Columbus, and discussed their many programs at Ohio State University.
