Activities during the year:

This year we started communicating with the WSSA student liaison, Nicholas Steppig from Purdue, to organize how we will be doing the joint meeting regarding students' business and events.

Some of the topics we are discussing:

- <u>Student night-out</u>: This is something that Nicholas seems interested to include WSSA students. The organization of the event may be more complex, but I also think we can include more professionals if we add WSSA on this. Would be good to advertise with WSSA members to try to participate.
- <u>Silent auction:</u> Since the silent auction is something that we do for the WSWS Elena Sanchez scholarship, we decided to keep that only for us. Another point is regarding the items and donations, since the logistics for it will be more difficult this year, we decided to ask people willing to donate items to send us photos of the items instead of the items itself and we can send these later after the meeting. I am also planning to suggest to people maybe donate local items or vouchers for activities in the island. One final topic about this is regarding the use of a crowd funding website to collect monetary donations, this will make the process easier and faster.
- <u>lunch/business section</u>: Since both societies students need a moment for business, I think we should try to keep some lunch/breakfast/appetizers that is usually sponsored by the industry separate but without an overlapping, since we may have students that have to participate in both events. However, we also think that would be good to have a joint event to create an interaction between all students.

- <u>Wellness breakfast:</u> Nicholas mentioned to me that last meeting that was a breakfast where students could openly talk about grad school issues and stressful situations. I liked this idea and I was wondering about the possibility of doing that next year. We are open for ideas of possible speakers or moderators for it. Please contact me if you have any person in mind.
- <u>Student paper contest:</u> I don't know if it was already decided if the paper contest will be kept separate or not. WSWS students showed on last year survey that they do not see a problem in joining the contest with WSSA.
- <u>Student Survey:</u> With the help of Larissa Larocca, the previous student representative, we conducted a survey with the students that were present in the last meeting at Denver. From all the 54 students only 17 answer the survey. I think would be good to ask advisors to encourage the students to answer the survey after next meeting. I will try to reinforce about it during our luncheon next meeting. The overall responses and feedbacks about the meeting and student contest were good. We will try to improve the topics mentioned in the survey. The full report about the questions made in the survey are attached to this document.

Recommendations for Board Action:



- Set one separate lunch for each student society and also, if possible, an event with all students from both societies together.




My advisor registered for me, I don't know how to do it. I know My PI said the website of submitting the powerpoint and abstract was not clear.



If I was given a 4 or 5 in one section, feedback in not so necessary, however if I was awarded a 3 or below in one section, it would be nice to have feedback stating why I was scored low so that I could improve next time. Feedback was given most times when this occurred, but not all.


It is my very first time to present my research outside of my department, I think the comments made by the judge were very fair. I talked to students who received the awards, I think they did better than I do.
